



HENRY IRVING: ENGLAND'S FIRST FAMOUS ACTOR

Sir Henry Irving (1838–1905) was an English stage actor in the Victorian era. He took complete responsibility (supervision of sets, lighting, direction, casting, as well as playing the leading roles) for season after season at the West End's Lyceum Theatre, establishing himself and his company as representative of English classical theatre. In 1895 he became the first actor to be awarded a knighthood, indicating full acceptance into the higher circles of British society.

Interesting facts about Henry Irving:

- Bram Stoker was his ardent supporter, and is even said to have based the character of Dracula to Irving!
- His stepson said of him, "Let me state at once, in clearest unmistakable terms, that I have never known of, or seen, or heard, a greater actor than was Irving."
- In 1887, the Exeter Theatre Royal fire claimed the lives of 186 people, and injured dozens more. Irving was one of the first high-profile people to donate to the relief fund for survivors and orphans. Moreover, this event inspired him to develop the "Irving Safety Theatre" principles. These principles included making the theatre site isolated, dividing the auditorium from the back of house, a minimum height above street level for any part of the audience, providing two separate exits for every section of the audience, improved stage construction including a smoke flue, and fire-resistant construction throughout. Which of these features do you see at the Bailey Studio?
